City Hall has received an increased number of calls regarding young children operating golf carts on city streets. Please take a moment to review the City's current golf cart ordinance.

62.07 GOLF CARTS.

Golf carts may be operated on City streets by persons possessing a valid motor vehicle operator's license. However, a golf cart shall not be operated upon a City street which is a primary road extension through the City but shall be allowed to cross a City street which is a primary road extension through the City. The most direct route to the golf course and back to the operator's residence must be used. The golf carts shall be equipped with a slow moving vehicle sign and a bicycle safety flag and shall be operated on streets only from sunrise to sunset. Golf carts operated on City streets shall be equipped with adequate brakes and shall meet any other safety requirements imposed by the Council. Golf carts are not subject to registration provisions.

Utility Tips

The most common home water leaks are dripping faucets, worn toilet flappers, and faulty valves. Here are some tips for easily identifying leaks in your home:

- Check your water meter before and after a two-hour period when no water is used. If the meter reading has changed, you could have a leak.
- Place a drop of food coloring in the toilet tank. Without flushing, wait ten minutes to see if any color appears in the bowl. If it does, you have a leak and will likely need to replace parts.
- Listen for a toilet that continues running after you flush. This is a sign that you have an issue with worn parts that need replacing.
- Observe faucet handles, gaskets, and fittings for signs of water outside the pipe that could indicate a leak.
- Check landscape irrigation systems before using it in the spring to make sure no damage occurred from frost or freezing.

We encourage you to monitor your utility bill each month. A slow drip or leak can quickly add up over time.
